Pastor Tina's Tidbits

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord



Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, (1 Peter 1:3 ESV)

As I write this I am looking out my living room window to see the snow coming down. I look at my neighbor's tree which just a few short months ago was brilliant in color and now it is desolate. This reminds me of the season we are in, not just the winter season, but the season before Easter. March 6th begins the Lenten season. For six weeks we will journey toward the cross. We will enter that period of desolation. We will weep with the followers of Jesus as we recall all that He endured on our behalf; and then we will rejoice. We will rejoice with thanksaiving knowing that God, the Father sent His only Son into the world for each of us. Through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we have hope. This isn't a hope such as I hope to get skinny someday; it is the hope that is rooted in the faith of salvation, the presence of the Holy Spirit and the assurance of life eternal. When we have this hope for our lives, we want others to have this hope too. How do we share this hope with others? We evangelize. Evangelism.....a word most people are scared of. People tend to think to evangelize you have to do things like stand on the street corner and pass out tracts that say things like "do you know where you are going?" or you meet someone new and the first thing you say to them is "do you know Jesus?" Evangelism

is vital in building the kingdom of God; however, we don't have to stand on the street corner or confront people. Evangelism is simply being a witness to the living hope of Jesus Christ. First and foremost, pray. Pray that God brings you to the person he wants you to evangelize to and pray for the person to whom you will evangelize. How many of you would invite a friend to go to a new restaurant that you tried and found to be delicious? If you can do that, you should be able to invite that friend to come and taste the bread of life and the living water. What about the stranger? Meet them on their turf; reach out to them where they are. See what their needs are and if there is a way to help. Maybe you can't physically help, but could refer them to where they could get help. Be kind, compassionate and caring. Build trust; once people trust you, they will be open to listen to what you have to say. Share your story of the hope you have found in Jesus. Through evangelism, we pray, that others will come out of their desolation into a relationship with the living hope of the world. Let us journey to the cross together.

<u>Lent</u>

During Lent, which starts with the observance of Ash Wednesday, many Christians prepare themselves for Easter through prayer, penance, repentance of sins, and self-denial. Many Christians fast and give up certain luxuries in order to replicate the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey into the desert for 40 days before beginning his public ministry, during which he endured temptation by Satan. Many read daily devotional and spend time in prayer, to draw themselves near to God.

Holy Week

Holy Week in Christianity is the week before Easter and includes Palm Sunday which was the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem described in all four gospels; Maundy Thursday, which commemorates the Last Supper, where Jesus gave his disciples the model for Holy Communion; and Good Friday, with the trial and crucifixion of Jesus ending in his death.

<u>Easter</u>

Celebrating the resurrection of our Lord and Savior! In all four gospels, we learn that after the Sabbath, Mary Magdalene and other women went to the tomb where Jesus was laid and they found that the tomb was empty. Jesus was gone! How frightening this must have been. In further reading of scripture we are assured that Jesus had conquered death and risen from the grave. He is Risen! He is Alive!

Lent & Easter Services

Wesley United, Christ United, Church of the Good Shepherd and Warriors Mark United Methodist Church will be joining together for the following Lent and Easter Services. All Palm Sunday services will be celebrated at <u>each of the individual churches</u> following their usual schedules.

March 6 – Ash Wednesday worship service will be at *Wesley UM Church* beginning at 7:00 pm.

April 18 – Maundy or Holy Thursday is a Christian Holy Day commemorating the Last Supper of Jesus Christ with the Apostles. The service will be held at *Christ United Methodist Church* beginning at 7:00 pm.

April 19 - Good Friday the Friday before Easter Sunday commemorates the crucifixion and death of Jesus Christ in the Christian Church. The service will be held at the *Church of the Good Shepherd* beginning at 7:00 pm. *April 21* - Easter Sunday, is a festival and holiday celebrating the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Christ United and Wesley will be joining together for a "**Sonrise**" (sunrise) service at 6:30 am in the Chapel of Wesley Church. Breakfast will be served in the Fellowship Hall after the "Sonrise" service (a sign-up sheet will be provided in the church sanctuary or you may call the church office at 814-684-3341).



Administrative Board

At the February 6th meeting four new members were welcomed: George LeGrand, Lay Leader; Larry Broadbent, Trustee Chairperson; Kendra Daughenbaugh and Rachel Chamberlin, members at large.

The Board approved a request from the Achievement House Cyber Charter School to use a space at Wesley for testing 3-4 students in April and May.

<u>Board of Trustee Report</u>

As the new Chairman of the Trustees I feel it's important that we let the congregation know who the current Trustees are. For 2019 the board includes David Hess, Gerald Campbell, Scott Hunter, Peg Baney, Tim Ashcroft, Terry Elder, Joyce Hewel, Ellie Spangler and myself, Larry Broadbent.

It is our duty to maintain and repair or make arrangements for repairs to the church building and the parsonage. Any member of our church should feel free to bring up anything that they feel needs to be looked into. Please put your suggestion in writing and give to any one of the Trustees. We will do our best to check out your concern and prioritize it as needed.

In an effort to improve storage space and organization we have started a clean-out effort in the church building. As part of that effort we have eliminated a large amount of waste that has been accumulating for years. The Tyrone Bulk Waste Cleanup will be held from April 9th thru 11th. We are asking the Department heads and helpers to go through any stored materials and sort out what can be thrown out. I would like for that to be scheduled during the week of April 1st thru 6th. Further details on this will be discussed at the next Trustees Meeting and made known to those involved.

The pew pad project is completed. They look good, and feel very comfortable too. We are still having some issues with the boilers which are being fixed at this time. Other small issues with the system will be fixed after the heating season. The heating schedules (times that rooms are heated for use) are being adjusted too. Masonry repairs above the front entrance will also be done as soon as the winter weather breaks. I do have a request, if any church member would be willing to assist with mowing the grass or in any other form of maintenance, please contact me or one of the other Trustees. We can surely use your help.

Emergency Readiness Planning Committee

A small group of our church members are working to devise plans and guidelines to provide security and safety for Wesley Church. The committee invited John Wagner, a local volunteer fireman, to come to tour our building and offer suggestions for improvements. John informed us that the fire extinguishers we currently have are water filled. Per his suggestion, the Trustees will research and add fire extinguishers that will meet the needs of various types of fires. He also suggested that we consider some type of emergency escape ladders for the third floor. Floor plans were discussed and we will update the floor plans to show all exits from our sanctuary and education buildings. Further plans will include devising an emergency evacuation plan. Watch the church bulletins for more information.

Currently, first aid kits are located in the kitchen, nursery, and sanctuary. We will be adding additional first aid kits so at least one kit is available in pertinent areas on each floor. John recommended that we consider obtaining an automated external defibrillator (AED). This information has been forwarded to the Trustees and Ad Council for their consideration.

CPR training will be scheduled soon for those who have signed up to take the course. If you haven't signed up and are interested, please call the church office ASAP-(814) 684-3341.

The congregational life committee met on January 16th A full slate of fellowship and worship opportunities were discussed. Lenten luncheons will be held starting March 6th with Fifth Sunday luncheons starting March 31st.
